Shaw and Vigel Marney.

By the Petition of William Cannoll of Prince Georges County accompanied by  
a transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of said County it appears that he was  
fined at September term eighteen hundred and fifteen six Pounds current money

for retailing cider at his dwelling House without licence. The Petitioner states that

that he is a poor man and has a large family to support and that in order to enable

him the better to do so he purchased Cypres and prepared them for such Gentlemen

as called on him for such liquors. The Petitioner further states that he was called for some Cypres

and when the Justice of the Peace called on him for some Cypres in the house, the Petitioner replied that

he had but would not sell any more unless he were licensed, that the said Justice observed

that he had no power to do so and that he would not sell any more unless he were licensed.

The Justice then ordered the Petitioner to pay the fine and costs at the rate of

one of a hundred and fifty pounds on the subject was obliged to pay at the Petitioner's

costs. The Court on consideration of which proceedings and from the recommendation

of the Justice of the Peace is of opinion that he should be permitted to sell Cypres
