

that they removed to the State of Maryland from the State of Virginia in the space
of the year eighteen hundred and fifteen and that since afterwards they opened
a small store in Washington County and that such was the penalty inflicted
by the laws of the state to selling spirituous liquors without licence as being igno-
rant that it was necessary to obtain a permit in the Court of the County to retail liquors
retail from the time of opening store until late in August ensuing sell whiskey
without licence. That being informed sometime in August eighteen hundred and
fifteen that it was a violation of the laws they applied to and obtained from the
honorable John Buchanan a licence. The Board in consideration of which circum-
stances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit
the said fines.

By the Petition of James J. Meach of Queen Anne's County it appears that
he was fined by the Court of the said County at October term eighteen hundred and
sixteen the sum of six pounds current money for selling spirituous liquors without
licence. The Petitioner states that he opened store for the sale of groceries in the year
eighteen hundred and fifteen on Kent Island and employed a certain William B.
Jomer as his clerk. That before he commenced selling liquor he requested the said
Jomer to obtain a licence for him from Queen Anne's County Court and gave him money to pay
for it. That the said Jomer did get a licence but took it on his own name instead of that of
the Petitioner. That the said Jomer died during the last winter and the Petitioner con-
tinued the sale of his groceries and did not discover the mistake of the licence taken
in the name of said Jomer until he was presented by the Grand Jury at
term eighteen hundred and sixteen. The Board on consideration of such
facts and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit
