The Petitioner states that in consequence of the illness of his wife he did not appear on said Court at the said term and that his recognizance was forfeited and an execution issued thereon to September Term eighteen hundred and sixteen on which he was taken and committed. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said recognizance.
