in Kent County Court on the penal sum of fifty Pounds Current Money with a  
condition that he should appear at the September Term of the said Court in the  
year eighteen hundred and fifteen to answer a presentment for assault and

and an execution issued thereon to September Term eighteen hundred and sixteen  
where he was taken and committed. The Board on consideration of which sum  
stated and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit  
the said recognizance.
