

Thursday December the 19th 1818

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honorable Henry H. Chapman, James Shaw and and William H. Ward

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Henry Thompson eight Dollars for cleaning the Senate Chamber as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George Brames ninety three Dollars and seventy five cents as a further compensation for riding as express for General Tompkins in eighteen hundred and thirteen and eighteen hundred and fourteen as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Riddle esquire twenty nine Dollars and eighty five cents for lead and flints furnished for the use of the militia as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Henry Holliday esquire Paymaster to the 8th Cavalry Regiment one hundred and forty four Dollars as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Isaac Spencer Paymaster to the 8th Cavalry Regiment one hundred and forty four Dollars as per account papered and filed.

Solomon Love contractor to be credited for the amount of his account this day papered and filed, two thousand and fifty seven dollars and seventy cents.

The honorable William Potter appeared in the Council Room and qualified before Benjamin Pindell esquire a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County by taking the several oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government and Laws of this State and by making and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion and also by taking an oath to support the Constitution of the United States.
