

Thursday March the 23rd 1817

The Council met. Present the honourable William Solter, Henry H. Chapman and James Shaw.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Johnathan Pinkney cashier of the Farmers Bank of Maryland nine hundred and sixty three Dollars and fifty cents it being the amount of J. Joseph Hennep account for sixty Rifles purchased of him by the Executive on the ninth day of November eighteen hundred and fourteen as per account paper and filed.

Samuel T. Hammond was appointed a Justice of the Levy Court of Talbot County vice Allen Bowie resigned and commission issued to Natham Harrington, Freeborn Banning, Royston A. Skinner, John Stevens Junior, James Seth, Thomas Hayward and Samuel T. Hammond as Justices of the Levy Court of Talbot County.

Robert Banning was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Talbot County and commission issued to William Thomas, James Seth, Francis Waightson, Thomas Martin, Samuel Roberts, Robert Spedden, John Stevens Junior, William Slaughter, Richard Harwood, Arthur Holt, Natham Harrington, William Welch, Felghimam Reid, Thomas Dudley, Richard Harrington, Joseph Bruff, Charles Goldborough, Stewart Redman (Boysides) Ignatius Rhodes, Henry Gapon, Samuel Nichols, Royston A.
