

The following Persons were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco at the respective Warehouses in Calvert County, to wit. At Lower Marlborough Warehouse Gavin H. Smith; At Bluffs Warehouse James Hollander; At Hunting Creek Warehouse John Norfolk, and At St Leonards Green Warehouse John Bourne. Gavin H. Smith being a new Inspector. Commission issued to them accordingly.

Thomas Brown and Andrew Slicer who were appointed on the sixth of February to value the work done in the Chancery office reported the value to be seven hundred and thirty Dollars and twenty seven cents and an Order issued on the Treasurer in favour of Washington G. Tuck for that sum.

Friday March the 14th 1817

The Council met. Present the honourable William Potter, Henry H. Chapman and James Shaw.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George Shaw Esquire Eighty three Dollars and eighteen and three quarter Cents for Stationary furnished for the use of the Executive Department as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council procure twenty seven Copies of the Laws of the United States now printing in pursuance of the Resolution of the General Assembly papered the fifth of February eighteen hundred and seventeen.

Ordered that the Register of the Chancery Court cause such Records of his office as may require it, to be substantially bound in pursuance of a Resolution of the General Assembly papered the fifth of February eighteen hundred and seventeen.

Ordered that the Adjutant General be and he is hereby required to address circulars to the several Lieutenant Colonels of Militia and Majors commanding the Battalions of this state requiring them forthwith to make return to him of the number of Arms Camps Equipage &c in their respective Regiments and Battalions, and to report such returns to this Department on or before the first month of July.
