The Petitioner states that as soon as he returned home and before he was presented he applied to Edmund Hey Coquian one of the associate Judges stating the aforesaid circumstances and requesting a license to cover the time from the expiration of his former license, that the Judge declined doing so but gave him one from the day of his application. The Petitioner states that he had no intention of violating the law. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine
