By the Petition of Bette Christopher and Elijah Johnson of Somerset County accompanied by a Transcript from the Court of the said County it appears that they were fined at April term eighteen hundred and seventeen six Pounds Current money for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioners state that a certain Clement Cathell owned a retail store and obtained a licence from the United States Collector not knowing that it was also necessary to have one from the State, that in August eighteen hundred and sixteen the said Cathell sold the said store to the Petitioners who proceeded to retail under Cathell's authority supposing that it was legal so to do. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court
