and fifty Dollars the valuation of the said Negro Jack.

Whereas Negro Harry Slave of Monocacy Jones of Saint Mary's County was under-
od arraigned and found guilty of an insurrection or rebellion and was by a special Court
held for the said County on the seventh day of April last sentenced to suffer death which
said sentence of death was commuted by the Governor on the seventeenth day of June last
to transportation to Apelousas there to be sold as a slave for life for the benefit of the State
of Maryland Therefore Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Monocacy
Jones four hundred and twenty five Dollars the valuation of the said Negro Harry.
