

Big Elk Creek on the edge of the Marsh and fast land, said beginning being also the original beginning of a Tract called Otter Point, and shown as such by John Helpatauck on his solemn oath on a former occasion and running up the Creek between the marsh and fast land the following courses and distances of Otter Point to wit North sixty four degrees East twenty eight Perches, North forty nine degrees East twenty four Perches, North thirty eight degrees East twenty six Perches, North ten degrees West seventeen Perches, then passing through the Marsh North forty five degrees East one hundred Perches, to a Mulberry Stump on the edge of the Marsh and fast land, then still by the lines of Otter Point North fifteen Perches, North thirty four degrees and a half West eight Perches, then North sixty degrees West eight Perches, South eighty two degrees and a half West five Perches, South thirty one degrees and a half West twenty two Perches, South fifty nine degrees and a half West twenty four Perches, South sixty five degrees and a half West eight Perches, South seventy seven Degrees and a half West eighteen Perches, North seventy two degrees and a half West twelve Perches, North fifty seven degrees and a half West eleven Perches, North eighty four degrees and a half West four Perches then still with Otter Point, South sixty degrees and a half West thirty six Perches, North fifty six degrees and a half West sixteen Perches, North thirty degrees and a half West eighty four Perches, North seven degrees and a half West twenty Perches, North twenty seven degrees and a half West seven Perches and seven tenths to the end of the line of a tract of land called Hollen Point then with Hollen Point bounded thereon South eight degrees and a half West thirty Perches
