Monday January the 19. 1818

The Council met. Present his Excellency the Governor, and the Honble Daniel. Murray, John Stoops, John Lager Howard Junior, Henry A. Ballis and Arnold E. Jones. Samuel L. Smith, John J. Sawelle, Thomas Billingsley, Sutton J. Meems, John J. Hillen, Alexander Broom, John Sedwick, John P. Williams, John G. Mackall, John H. Chew, Joseph M. Reynolds, James S. Callison, William Clare, Thomas E. King Young Dorsey, James Hollingshead, Walter Smith, John Fitzhugh, James Duke, and Hezekiah, Culbuth, were appointed and commissioned Justices of the Peace for Calvert County.

John J. Sawelle, John G. Mackall, Thomas Billingsley, Alexander Broom John J. Hillen, Sutton J. Meems, and Joseph M. Reynolds, were appointed and commissioned Justices of the Levy Court for Calvert County.

Samuel L. Smith, James Duke and John H. Chew were appointed Justices of the Orphans Court for Calvert County and Commission issued to them accordingly.

The following persons were appointed Inspectors of tobacco at the respective Warehouses in Baltimore County to wit, At Hells Point Warehouse Nicholas Ridgely, At the Head of the Basin Richard Britson and at Dugan and O'Donnell's Warehouse Colonel Richard Waters. Colonel Richard Waters being a new Inspector Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain John Boshaw of Dorchester County, twenty seven dollars and fifty three cents, for provisions furnished for the use of the Militia of said County, in August eighteen hundred and fourteen; as per account passed and filed.
