

Wednesday February, 4 1818

The council met present His Excellency the Governor and the Honble Daniel Murray, John & Howard Junior and Henry A. Callis.

The following persons were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco for the respective Warehouses in Prince Georges County, to wit,

At Queen Anne Warehouse William Mills, and Samuel Tyler, at Upper Marlboro Warehouse Edward Scott, At Nottingham Warehouse, Aquila Beall, At Magruder's Warehouse, James Bacon, At Piscataway Warehouse Samuel Coe and at Bladensburgh Warehouse John M. Daniel and Samuel Magruder.

The following persons were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco at the respective warehouses in Saint Marys County, to wit, At Chaptico Warehouse, Joseph Shammell, and at Leonard Town Warehouse, Benedict Drury.

The following persons were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco at the respective Warehouses in Charles County, to wit, at Port Tobacco Warehouse, Hugh Cuy, At Vanyemoy Warehouse John Adams of Francis, At Pomonkey Warehouse, Walter W. Hannon, At Benedict Warehouse, Zachariah Lotheron and at Piles Warehouse, Philip Thomas Marshall.

Andrew Ellicott was appointed a justice of the Levy Court for Baltimore County and commission issued to Robert Walsh, John J. Worthington, Samuel Owings of Samuel, James Hindman, Samuel Stevenson of Henry, John Beale Howard, William Jessop, Robert Lyon, John Merryman of Benjamin, Henry Thompson and Andrew Ellicott, as justices of the Levy Court for said County,

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. James Mills, ninety dollars, for riding express by order of the Executive as per account.

John W. Thomas was appointed Inspector of salted fish for the city of Baltimore, and commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Nathan Wells, for ferriages for the company under the command of Captain Hamilton, on their march to Annapolis, in August eighteen hundred and sixteen, per account.
