

of the agents must necessarily depend on the services rendered.

You will be pleased therefore to pursue the business of the trust reposed in you: collecting the arms and depositing them in the proper arsenals.

It will be proper also to state in your accounts the whole amount of monies actually expended with vouchers, and the number of days on which you were actually employed in this service. The Accounts will be acted on and finally settled at a meeting of the Board on the second wednesday in June next.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonas Green, Esquire employed to print a compilation of the laws, one thousand dollars to be by him hereafter accounted for.

Ordered, that the clerk of the Council procure as far as practicable from the militia officers the vouchers required by the agent for settling the claim of the State of Maryland against the United States for militia services the following letter was accordingly sent to the Brigadier Generals and Colonels of the respective Regiments.

Sir. Council Chamber Annapolis April 15. 1818.

It is important that the Executive should have in their possession the orders of the Officers calling out the militia from time to time during the late war, to repel the enemy, and I am Directed by them, respectfully to request, that you will be pleased to cause to be collected and forwarded to this Department, as soon as possible, any orders that may have been issued either by yourself or any other officer within your Regiment, during the late war for the purpose above stated. I do not deem it to be necessary for me to say more than that it is desired and expected, that the orders so far as you may be able to procure them, shall be sent to the Executive before the first day of June next.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Gotlieb Grammer fifty seven dollars for riding express as per account passed.
