Ordered, that Mr. Allen Dorsey be appointed agent of the State in Baltimore for collecting public arms and stores, and to provide for their safe keeping, and to carry into effect the sixty third section of the act of the last session relative to the militia in the city of Baltimore, and that he be authorized to receive on the part of this State, and report to the adjutant general the proportion of the Quota of arms which the State of Maryland is entitled to receive from the United States under the act of congress passed in April in the year eighteen hundred and eight.

Ordered, that the clerk of the Council request the attorney general of this State to attend to a suit brought by Jehu Bandler Printer in Baltimore county Court against the State of Maryland.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Stewart Pay Master to the tenth Regimental Cavalry District thirty two Dollars for paying off the Cavalry of said District from April 1813 to this date.

Ordered, that the Armorer be directed to sell such Sents, camp Kettles and powder in his possession as are in a perishing condition.
