Lawrence Thomson Esquire having produced to the Governor an exequatur signed by the President of the United States, and sealed with the seal of the said States, recognizing him as Vice Consul of his Danish Majesty for the Port of Baltimore. Ordered that the said Recognition be published for the information and Government of the people of this State. Given under my hand and the Seal of the State of Maryland this eighth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.

To all whom it may concern.

Lawrence Thomson Esquire having produced to me his commission as Vice Consul of Danish Majesty for the Port of Baltimore. I do hereby Recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges, as are allowed to Vice Consuls of the most favoured nations in the United States. In Testimony Whereof, I have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed.
