

to the Resolution of the Legislature, by the Treasurer of the Western Shore it appearing, from an examination of the Papers, and the opinion of the honourable Attorney General that the said lot was not liable to confiscation.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Samuel Livermore, Esquire, three hundred Dollars, for his Services in Attending on the part of the State to the suit of Jehu Chandler against the State of Maryland, and for preparing and forwarding the suit against the Branch Banks of the United States established in Baltimore and for other legal services.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Clement Brooke, Paymaster to the Thirty fourth Regiment, two hundred dollars for pay allowed him in full of his account for services in paying off the militia of said Regiment from April eighteen hundred and thirteen to this date as per account passed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Washington G Luck thirty dollars and eighty cents for work done in the Chancery Office as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William D Brall, one hundred and eighty seven dollars and sixty two and a half cents for publishing sundry laws &c as per account.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Editors of the Federal Republican one hundred and eighty three dollars and twenty five cents for publishing sundry laws &c as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Joseph Smith one hundred and seventy eight dollars for publishing sundry Laws &c as per account passed by the Auditor.
