The Council met present His Excellency the Governor and the Honourable John Eager Howard Junr. Henry H Chapman and John Hoops.

On the joint recommendation of the two Houses of the Legislature a Commission was ordered to issue by his Excellency the Governor to Thomas S Bond as Register of Wills for Harford County. Commission issued

Ordered, that a proclamation issue offering the sum of one hundred dollars in each case, or fifty dollars for each offender if there be more than one, for apprehending and bringing to punishment the person or persons who burnt a Barn belonging to Benjamin Hanson, a corn house belonging to Richard Price, and setting fire to a stable belonging to William Crain all of Kent County.
