Schoofields sixteen dollars and forty cents for services in April eighteen hundred and fourteen; Captain Marshalls for his own services in placing guards five dollars and twenty six cents; Ensign William Tules five dollars and twenty cents for services in April eighteen hundred and fourteen and Ensign William Murrells for one days service in hauling up open craft sixty six cents which several payments have been authorised by a Resolution passed at December session eighteen hundred and eighteen.

Monday April 19th 1819

The Council met present His Excellency the Governor and the Hon^{ble} John Eager Howard Junior Henry H. Chapman and John Stoops.

By the Petition of Frederick R. Kinnier; accompanied by a transcript from the Proceedings of Baltimore City Court it appears, that he was fined by the said Court at November Term eighteen hundred and eighteen, the sum of twenty four dollars
