

of sixty dollars each for the appearance of a certain William Armstrong, at Prince Georges County Court at April Term eighteen hundred and sixteen to answer a charge of felony &c. The Petitioners state that the said William Armstrong did appear at the said Court, but that he left the same without being discharged, that the said Armstrong is a free Negro, and that they believed that they were discharged from the recognizance by the appearance of the said Armstrong. They further state that there were two charges against him one for stealing the property, and the other for receiving it knowing it to have been stolen, that he was tried on the first charge and acquitted - and was anxious to be tried on the second; but the State not being ready it was postponed, and the said Armstrong then left the Court without having the recognizance respited. The Board on consideration of the above circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeitures.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonas Green, Esquire, one thousand dollars, towards defraying his expenses in printing the compilation of the Laws since Kilty's Edition under a Resolution of the General Assembly passed at December session eighteen hundred and seventeen.

Ordered that John Shaw Armourer at Annapolis and Robert Spedden Armourer at Easton forward to Allen Dorsey of the City of Baltimore the powder in their possession respectively, the said John Shaw retaining at least two kegs of Cannon and four of fine powder for future purposes and that the said Robert Spedden retain two kegs of Cannon.

Ordered, that the Secretary write to Allen Dorsey, requesting him to dispose of the said Powder in such manner as he may think most advantageous to the State, the proceeds thereof to be accounted for by said Dorsey with this Department; and that such commission be allowed him after deducting all expenses as is usually given to commission Merchants in Baltimore city for similar services.
