In Testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington the twenty seventh day of May A.D. one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and of the independence of the United States of America the forty third.

The State of Maryland To the Sheriff of Baltimore County Greeting.

Whereas a certain Johnson alias Williams stands charged on the Affidavit of John Sherrett, taken before Abraham Shoemaker, Esquire one of the Aldermen of the City of Philadelphia; also on the oath of Andrew Agnew taken before Samuel L Southard, Esquire, one of the Justices of the Supreme Court of the State of New Jersey, with having committed a felony in the City of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania, on or about the ninth day of July last, of which affidavits duly authenticated Copies have been transmitted to me; and Whereas it has been represented to me that the said Johnson alias Williams hath been arrested and is now confined in Jail in the City of Baltimore; And Whereas His Excellency William Findlay Governor of the State of Pennsylvania; hath represented to me that the said Johnson alias Williams hath fled from the Justice of the State of Pennsylvania; having jurisdiction of the offence aforesaid to the State of Maryland; and hath demanded of the Executive of this State the delivery of the said Johnson alias Williams as a fugitive from justice; and hath notified to me in due form that he hath appointed John Mcmasters of the City of Philadelphia Agent to remove him to the State of Pennsylvania. I have therefore thought proper to order and direct that you deliver the said Johnson alias Williams
