

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John P. Thompson, twenty dollars the amount of his account for printing.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonas Green Esquire, five hundred dollars as a further advance for printing the laws compiled by Messrs. Kelly Harris and Watkins to be by him accounted for.

Ordered, That the eleven field pieces with their appurtenances, offered by the General Government to be received by this State in part of her proportion of arms due to the State of Maryland from the United States, and that the Clerk of the Council give a receipt for the same to be delivered to the States Agent of Arms W. Allen Dorsey in the City of Baltimore.

Ordered, That the Agents deliver the aforesaid field pieces with their appurtenances to the proper officers of the first Regiment of Artillery on their giving Bond and security for the same as required by law.

Ordered, That the Clerk of the Council inform Lieutenant Braden officer of Ordnance for the United States, that two hundred Rifles will be received in lieu of muskets equal to their value in further payment of this States proportion of arms due from the General Government.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Barroll, one dollar and twelve and a half cents, for sending an express to the Honourable John Stoops, as per account passed and filed.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr James Holland messenger to the Council the sum of four hundred dollars for the purpose of supplying wood for the State to be by him accounted for.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr James Holland, one hundred and twenty dollars, for sweeping and making fires in the Auditors room and the Court of Appeals room, the same not being a part of his duty as messenger of the Council and always paid and allowed to Mr Fowler the former messenger as per account passed and filed.

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Mr James Holland seven dollars and seventy eight cents the balance of his account for wood.
