

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Munroe Esquire, forty six dollars and eighty five and a half cents for Postages for the Executive Department to the first of October as per account passed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Brewer Esquire, one hundred and fifty dollars for six months salary as Clerk of the House of Delegates due the first Instant.

Ordered, by the Governor that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Perry Benson, sixty dollars for one quarters half pay due the first instant, under the provisions of the act of Assembly passed at November Session seventeen hundred and eighty five Entitled "An Act for the relief of certain maimed and disabled Officers."

Ordered, that Mr George Shaw be employed to purchase in pursuance of Resolutions of the General Assembly passed at the last Session Digests of the laws of the following States and Territories to wit, Connecticut, Kentucky, Illinois, Alabama, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, Mississippi, Missouri Territory, Arkansas Territory, and Michigan Territory also five copies of Seyberts Statistical Annals of the United States.

By the Petition of James Gettings of Montgomery County, accompanied by a transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March Term eighteen hundred and nineteen six pounds current money for selling spirituous liquor without license. The Petitioner states that he entered into a Recognizance on the twelfth of March eighteen hundred and seventeen with two securities and obtained from a Judge of the Orphans Court of the said County permission to keep a public House of entertainment until the following November Court. That from ignorance of the law he omitted to file his recognizance within the time required by law. The Petitioner prays that as he violated the law through ignorance and not design, to be released from said fine. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.
