The Petitioner states that some short time after he was appointed Inspector of Tobacco at Port Tobacco Warehouse, he purchased in parcels of Joseph Dixon about five hundred pounds of Tobacco, and John Maddox about nine hundred pounds. He states that at the time he was entirely ignorant of the existence of any Law which forbid him to do so - that he gave a fair price for it and purchased the Tobacco rather to accommodate the sellers who are poor than from any other motive. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of the case, do on the recommendation of the court remit the said fines.
