

same year, he visited his relations in Virginia, and from thence extended his excursion to the Springs, with a view to the improvement of his health, which at that period was very precarious, and did not return home until September, when he understood that Negro Lewis, had attended Court, at the term above mentioned, which induced the Petitioner from his ignorance of the Proceedings in such cases, to believe that he was freed from all further responsibility in the matter, that not having been notified to the contrary, by any legal process for upwards of two years - he remained under the impression, until about October last, when he received information, that his recognizance was forfeited. The Petitioner states that he has entered into another recognizance for the appearance of the said Negro Lewis at March term next. The Board on the recommendation of the Honorable John R. Plater, one of the judges of the said Court, and of respectable persons, among whom is the District Attorney, do order and direct that the said forfeiture be remitted.
