Monday February 28. 1820

The State of Maryland to wit. Whereas a certain Martin Morris
alias James Jones, charged with the commission of a felony in the common-
wealth of Virginia and being demanded by the Executive of the said
Commonwealth, under the laws of Congress of the United States as a fugitive
from the justice of the said Commonwealth to the State of Maryland, hath
been ordered to be delivered to the custody of Mr David Handley, an agent duly
appointed by the Executive of the said Commonwealth of Virginia to remove
said fugitive, and convey him to the said Commonwealth for trial according
to law. Now therefore all persons within the State of Maryland
are hereby required and enjoined to let the said David Handley pass with
said Prisoner unmolested, to Virginia by the said David Handley conducting
himself in a peaceable and orderly manner and using no improper
severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said Prisoner.
