The State of Maryland, to the Sheriff of Baltimore County greeting.
Whereas a certain William Quinlin stands charged on the affidavits of Ellis
Clark made before Samuel Badger Esquire an Alderman in and for the City of
Philadelphia on the twenty sixth day of February last with having fraudulently
-ly and by means of false pretences and tokens obtained from the said Ellis Clark
and his partner Benjamin Clarke six gold Patent Lever Watches, of which
affidavit an authenticated copy has been transmitted to me. And whereas it is
represented to me that the said William Quinlin hath been arrested and is
now confined in the Jail of Baltimore County And Whereas His Excellency
William Findlay Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hath
represented to me that the said William Quinlin, hath fled from the jurisdiction
of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania having jurisdiction of the offence aforesaid
to the State of Maryland, and hath demanded of the Executive of this State the
delivery of the said William Quinlin as a fugitive from justice and hath
notified to me in due form that he hath appointed Mr George Campbell of
the City of Philadelphia Agent to remove him to the said Commonwealth of
Pennsylvania. I have therefore thought proper to order and direct that you
deliver the said William Quinlin to the said George Campbell to be removed
to the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania provided the said William Quinlin
has not been committed to the said Jail for having violated any of the laws of
this State and provided also that the said George Campbell do first pay and
discharge all costs of the said Commitment. Given under my hand

in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
