

The State of Maryland to wit. Whereas a certain William Quindlin charged in the affidavit of Ellis Clark made before Samuel Badger Esquire an alderman for the City of Philadelphia on the twenty sixth day of February last with having fraudulently and by means of false pretences and tokens obtained from the said Ellis Clark and his partner Benjamin Clark six gold Patent Lever watches and being demanded by the Executive of Pennsylvania, under the laws of the Congress of the United States as a fugitive from the justice of the said Commonwealth to the State of Maryland, hath been ordered to be delivered to the custody of W George Campbell an agent duly appointed by the Executive of the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to remove said fugitive and convey him to the said Commonwealth for trial according to law. and therefore all persons within the State of Maryland are hereby required and enjoined to let the said George Campbell pass with said Prisoner unmolested to Pennsylvania let the said George Campbell conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said Prisoner beyond what is necessary and proper for his safe custody. Given under my hand and the seal of the State of Maryland this seventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty.
