

The State of Maryland to wit. Whereas a certain John M^r Farland charged with committing the crime of fornication in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and being demanded by the Executive of the said Commonwealth under the Laws of the Congress of the United States, as a fugitive from the justice of the said Commonwealth to the State of Maryland, hath been ordered to be delivered to the custody of Mr Emanuel Haner an agent duly appointed by the Executive of the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to remove said fugitive and convey him to the said Commonwealth for trial according to law. Now therefore all persons within the State of Maryland are hereby required and enjoined to let the said Emanuel Haner pass with said prisoner unmolested to Pennsylvania he the said Emanuel Haner conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner, beyond what is necessary and proper for his safe custody. Given under my hand and the Seal of the State of Maryland this twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty.
