Now in order to bring to condign punishment the perpetrator or perpetrators of so diabolical an act I have thought proper to issue this my Proclamation and do by and with the advice and consent of the Council offer a Reward of two hundred dollars to any person who shall discover apprehend and prosecute to conviction the Perpetrator or Perpetrators of the said act. Given under my hand and the Seal of the State of Maryland at the City of Annapolis this twelfth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty.
