

Council Chamber Annapolis July 12th 1820

Sir

I am directed to inform you, that a suit will be ordered against you to recover back such part of the money that was advanced to you in 1817 as Agents to collect the public arms as shall not be accounted for by you on or before the first of September next - On the twenty eighth of August the Executive will meet, and you can either come down at that time and arrange with them, or before and settle with me, provided you can be here before the twenty fourth Instant, as I intend leaving home on that day, and will not be back until the twenty sixth of August - The Resolution of the Legislature of which I sent you a copy is peremptory, and leaves no discretion to be used by this Department.

Ordered, that Raphael Peale Jr and he is hereby authorized and requested, to examine the Portrait of General Washington, the Marquis la Fayette and Colonel Tilghman the Aids of the General, now in the room of the House of Delegates, and do with the same what in his Judgment as an artist may be necessary to restore the said Portrait to its original freshness of appearance and strength of colours, and that this department will pay for the same his charge not exceeding twenty dollars.
