Wednesday February the 14<sup>th</sup> 1821

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honourable John Stephen, Thomas H. Wilkinson, James Butcher and Grafton Duwall.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Tidings, fifteen Dollars, for riding Expres to Major Wilkinson as per account papered and filed.

• Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Sullivan four Dollars eighty seven and an half Cents for sweeping Government House Chimneys as per account papered and filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Henry Thompson fifty five dollars for riding Expres to the Sheriff of Frederick County with Death Warrants as per account papered and filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Washington G. Tuck, two hundred Dollars, for expences and so forth incurred on transporting Arms and Military stores from Baltimore to Annapolis and Frederick Town, in part of his account.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor George M'ulloch, Michael C. Sprigg and Thomas Blair were appointed Commissioners to inspect the United States Turnpike Road

and to report to him accordingly.
