Tuesday March 27 "1821

Baldwin, esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County by taking the several oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government and laws of this state, as also by making and subscribing a Declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, and also by taking an oath to support the Constitution of The United States.
