

George Frankhouse and John Cove on the sum of fifty Dollars each - that the said Recognizance was forfeited in consequence of the non appearance of the said Shekels - The Petitioners state and the same appears from the Transcript of the Proceedings of the said Court, that the said William Shekels made a voluntary surrender of himself to the Sheriff of Frederick County, was tried and fined for the offence aforesaid fifteen Dollars - The Petitioners further state that the offence whereof the said Wilks Shekels was convicted, originated in an attempt on his part to obtain possession of a certain Mepuage by him purchased of which the said Mary Cain had at that time the wrongful possession - nor would he have proceeded to the use of force on that occasion, but for the advice given him by a person in whose opinion he had confidence, and the grant of said Mepuage that the said Shekels is a very illiterate man and so poor as to be unable to procure even the common necessities of life - and burthened with a large and growing family. The Board do on the recommendation of the said Court remit the said forfeitures.

By the Petition of James Duffee, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of Baltimore City Court it appears that he was fined the sum of twenty four dollars by the said Court, at February term last, for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that he obtained a licence from the City Court of Baltimore to keep an ordinary, at the intersection of Eulaw and Mulberry Streets - that he shortly thereafter removed into Biddle Street, and supposing that he had a right to sell under the licence which had not expired, he did so. The Petitioner states that he is wholly unable to pay the said fine. The Board do on the recommendation of the said Court remit the said fine of twenty four dollars.
