

By the Petition of James Langston, Francis Parnott, William Colscott, Thomas Sawcibury, Edward White, Bennett Wherrell, Aaron Marshalls, John Morgan of Solomon, Charles M. Smith, and William Roe of Caroline County it appears that they entered into a Recognizance for the appearance of a certain George Morgan at Caroline County Court, to answer a charge of felony. The Petitioners state that the said George Morgan absconded, and that he was afterwards apprehended and committed to jail by the Petitioners. That he broke jail and run off, by reason of which it was impossible for the Petitioners to comply with the term of the Recognizance which was declared to be forfeited. They pray to be released from the said forfeiture. The Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said Recognizance.

By the Petition of Francis Castine, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of Baltimore County Court, it appears that he together with a certain Nathan Imloes entered into a Recognizance in the sum of sixty dollars for the appearance of the said Imloes at March Term eighteen hundred and eighteen to prosecute two negro men Ephraim Smith, and Edward Caroon for an assault and Battery committed on him. The Petitioner states that the said Imloes being ignorant of the law, did not appear at the said Term when the Recognizance was forfeited, but did appear at the following term, when an Indictment was found by the Grand Jury. The Board taking into consideration that there has not been any failure of justice do on the recommendation of the Chief Judge of the said Court remit the said forfeiture.
