intentionally violated the law - The Court having recommended a remission of the said fine
The Board do after having duly considered the circumstances of the case order and direct
that the said Rachel Jones be released from the said fine of twenty four dollars.

It appears by the Petition of Francis Turpin of Dorchester County, that he entered into
a Recognizance in the sum of eighty dollars, current money, on the twenty fourth day of August
in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty, for his appearance at the next sitting
of Dorchester County Court, and for his continuance there until regularly discharged by
the Court. that he appeared at the said Court, viz, on the fourth Monday in October, eighteen
hundred and twenty, and after continuing his attendance he applied to The Judges to be dis-
charged, who upon enquiry ascertained that no recognizance had been returned, and thereupon
immediately discharged him - that shortly afterwards the Recognizance was returned, and at
the end of the Term he was called and neglecting to appear the Recognizance was forfeited - The
Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County order and direct that the said Fran-
cis Turpin be released from the said forfeiture
