

found on five cases the sum of sixteen dollars in each case for selling spirituous liquors without license - The Petitioner states that he violated the law from ignorance and not from a disposition to cheat or defraud the state - that he had obtained a license from Anne Arundel County Court to sell spirituous liquor - that he did not attend to the time when his license expired and not knowing that it had expired did sell after its expiration upon the times mentioned in the presentments against him - That he is a poor man with a family and that he is unable to pay the said fines without serious injury to his family - The Board after having duly considered all the circumstances connected with this case do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said fines amounting in the whole to the sum of eighty dollars.

It appears by the Petition of David Jones and Hugh Anderson that at March term eighteen hundred and nineteen, at Baltimore County Court, a presentment and Indictment were found by the Grand Jury against the Petitioner David Jones, for keeping a disorderly house, and that they entered into a Recognizance in the sum of fifty dollars, for the appearance of the said David Jones at Baltimore County Court to answer the same - That the said David Jones is not guilty of the charge alleged against him, and has always been ready prepared for the trial of the offence laid to his charge - That at September term eighteen hundred and twenty, during the accidental absence of the said David Jones and of his counsel, the said Recognizance was called and forfeited, and it appearing further from the representation of the said Court that there has not been a failure of justice, The Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said Recognizance.
