

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^{rs} Rebecca Forrest, ninety dollars for one Quarters half pay due the first of May Instant, allowed by a Resolution of October Session seventeen hundred and eighty.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^{rs} Ann Lowacker, forty dollars, for one Quarters half pay due the first of May Instant, under the provisions of the Act of Assembly passed at November Session seventeen hundred and eighty five Chapter fifty two, Entitled "An Act for the relief of the widows of such officers of this State who have died in the continental service."

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Joseph Dannon, ten dollars, for one Quarters half pay due the first Instant, allowed by a Resolution of the General Assembly passed at April Session seventeen hundred and ninety two.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lazarus Harman, twenty dollars, for six months half pay due the first Instant.

By the Petition of Joseph Crouchly of Anne Arundel County, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears that he was fined by Anne Arundel County Court, at September Term eighteen hundred and twenty, the sum of two dollars for committing an assault upon the body of Henry Hedges and the quantity of 2000 Pounds of Tobacco for suffering cards to be played at his house on the Sabbath day - That he has since that had his license renewed to him - that he has a large family, is poor and unable to pay the said fines, and it appearing further from the evidence of a number of respectable persons that the said Joseph Crouchly has always borne a good character in his neighborhood, and that the house kept by him as an ordinary has never to their knowledge been reported to be a disorderly and notorious one. The Board having duly considered the circumstances attending said case, do on the recommendation of the said Court remit the said fine of two dollars and as much of the fine of 2000 lb of Tobacco as the State is entitled to.
