

Judgment due to the State of Maryland, from William R. Dawson late Sheriff of said County and William Lamas and Peter Gebhart securities for three hundred and sixteen dollars and ninety one Cents is well and sufficiently secured, and it further appearing from letters received from the Treasurer of the Western Shore and the District Attorney for the fifth Judicial District of Maryland, that the Interest and Costs arising on said sum have been duly paid and satisfied. The Governor and Council do on the application of said Parties order and direct that all Proceedings on the said Judgment be stayed until the first day of January eighteen hundred and twenty two.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor George G. Simmons was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Talbot County in the Place of George P. Simmons and a new Commission issued to Peter Denny, William Jenkins, William Harrison Junior, Stephen Reynier, William W. Haddaway, James Wainwright, James Esqate, Samuel G. Garey, Bennett Bracco, Samuel Colston, Philemon Willis, Richard Robertson, Robert Lloyd, Richard Sherwood, Thomas Jones, Edward Martin, Foster Maynard, William Caulk, Joseph Harrison of Joseph, Thomas Kemp, Robert Dodson, Jeremiah Valiant, Joseph Turner Junior, Benjamin Benny, Edward Roberts, William A. Leonard, James Chambers, Levin Mills, Joseph Turner, John Leverton, Henry Thomas, James Seth, Solomon Dickinson, William Rose, Lambert Clayland, James Chaplain Junior, Thomas Wells, and George G. Simmons as Justices of the Peace for Talbot County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Honourable Thomas H. Wilkinson, one hundred and thirty three Dollars and fifty Cents, for one Quarters salary as Member of the Council; due the first of June last.

By the Petition of George Waller of Somerset County, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears that he was fined by the said Court, at May Term eighteen hundred and twenty one, the sum of one hundred dollars for selling foreign goods wares and merchandizes without license. The Petitioner states that his Father James L. Waller, who resided at the same place, had obtained a
