

eighteen, but although Indictments were then found against them, no trials took place at the said Term, and the Petitioner being under the impression that the condition of the Recognizances in which he was bound, had been complied with by the appearance of the said Bonoway and Stewart at the said Term, did not afterwards attend to the said Indictments, nor did he hear any thing further relating to the said Recognizances until the month of February last when he was informed that they were forfeited by reason of the non appearance of the said Bonoway and Stewart. The Petitioner states that the aforesaid Joseph Neilson, who charged the said Bonoway and Stewart with having assaulted him, and who was bound in a Recognizance to the state to attend and give testimony as a witness against them, omitted and neglected so to attend by reason whereof his said Recognizance was forfeited - and the suits against the said Bonoway and Stewart have been struck off by order of the Court of Baltimore County. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said Recognizances on payment of costs.
