Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore report to the Clerk of the Executive Council as soon as practicable, the amount of Taxes on Chancery proceedings annually received into the Treasury since the first day of January eighteen hundred.

The State of Maryland, to all whom it may concern. Hieronymus Daniel Mickelhausen, Esquire, having produced to the Executive of this State Exequator, signed by the President of the United States, and sealed with the Seal of the said States, recognizing him as Consul General of the free and Hans Towns of Lubbeck and Bremen to reside at the City of Baltimore. Ordered that the said Recognitions be published for the information and government of the people of this State.

James Munroe, President of the United States of America to all whom it may concern. Hieronymus Daniel Mickelhausen having produced to me his commission as Consul General of the free and Hans Town of Bremen to reside at the City of Baltimore. I do hereby recognise him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges as are allowed to the Consul General of the most friendly nations between whom and the United States there is no particular agreement for the regulation of the consular functions. In Testimony whereof, I have caused these to be made Patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed - Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the tenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, and of the Independence of the United States of America the forty sixth.
