

James Munroe President of the United States of America. To all whom it may concern. Hieronymous Daniel Wickelhausen having produced to me his commission as Consul General of the free and Hans Town of Lubeck to reside at the City of Baltimore. I do hereby recognise him as such and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions powers and privileges as are allowed to the Consul General of the most friendly nations, between whom and the United States there is no particular agreement for the regulation of the Consular functions. In Testimony whereof, I have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the tenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and twenty one, and of the Independence of the United States of America the forty sixth.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jacob Metzger one hundred and fifty dollars, for six months salary as Armourer at Frederick Town, due the twenty third of June last.
