Ordered that the following be published four times in the Maryland Republican at Annapolis, the Patriot and American at Baltimore.

The State of Maryland, to all whom it may concern - Henry G. Jacobson, esquire, having produced to the Executive of this State, an Exequatur, signed by the President of the United States, and sealed with the Seal of the said States, Recognizing him as Vice Consul of His Danish Majesty, for the State of Maryland, to reside at the City of Baltimore. Ordered that the said Recognition be published for the information and Government of the people of this State

Satisfactory evidence having been exhibited to me, that Henry G. Jacobson, is appointed Vice Consul of His Danish Majesty, for the State of Maryland, to reside at Baltimore, I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges, as are allowed to Vice Consuls of the most favoured Nations, between whom and the United States, there is no particular agreement for the regulation of Consular functions.
