

On the second Monday in December, and the tenth day of the same month, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, the General Assembly of Maryland, agreeably to the Constitution and form of Government proceeded to the choice of Governor when His Excellency Samuel Sprigg was selected.

On the Tuesday following, and the eleventh day of the same month, the General Assembly made choice of the following Gentlemen, as Council to the Governor, to wit: Israel D. Haulsby, James Butcher, Thomas H. Wilkinson, Nicholas Brewer and James Vabb Esquires.

Tuesday December the 11th 1821

His Excellency Samuel Sprigg qualified in the presence of the Members of both Houses of the Legislature, by taking the several oaths required by the Constitution and form of Government, and the laws of this state, and by subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion; and also in taking an oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

Wednesday December 12th 1821

The honourable Nicholas Brewer, appeared in the Council Chamber and qualified before Thomas H. Carroll Esquire, Recorder of the City of Annapolis agreeably to the Constitution and laws of this state, and by subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, and also by taking an oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

His Excellency the Governor appeared in the Council Chamber.

Thursday December 13th 1821

Friday December 14th 1821
