The Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said forfeitures on the payment of costs.

By the Petition of James Harrison of Charles County accompanied by a Transcript from the proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at August Term eighteen hundred and twenty one, two thousand weight of Tobacco for purchasing and receiving corn of Negroes George and Anthony the property of Ignatius Semmes. The Petitioner states that he has been a retailer in Port Tobacco for five years last past, and that it had been his uniform determination to refrain from dealing with negroes in any manner, and had given directions to his assistant never to purchase any thing of them, except they produced a line from their owner - and when the corn was offered, which was the cause of the said presentment he refused to purchase unless a line was produced, when the negroes
