

By the Petition of Ralph Hamman of Worcester County, it appears that he was fined by the Court of the said County, at May term eighteen hundred and twenty one for retailing spirituous liquors without license. That his conduct in this particular has been the result of ignorance and misapprehension, and not from any intention of committing a violation of the law. That he took a permit from Judge Whittington one of the Judges of the said Court in the month of February eighteen hundred and twenty, and was under the honest impression that he could sell, under the same, spirituous liquors, and never knew to the contrary until he had broken the law. That he is poor with a wife and children to support. The Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said fine.

An account for \$2502 for 139 Barrels of Pork, that were purchased by the Executive on the 7th of August 1813, from the United States, has been presented to the Governor and Council for payment. This Pork was placed in the hands of Alexander and Welch Contractors for supplying the Militia with rations, and was not used. One hundred and fifteen Barrels were taken in part payment of their account, and has been charged to the United States in the account of the State of Maryland filed in the Treasurer's office, and the remainder
