It appearing from the Records of this Department that the sum of \$3000 was  
advanced to Solomon Lowe, late Contractor of Talbot County, for supplying the  
Militia with Rations during the late war, and that the said Lowe has only accounted  
for the sum of two thousand two hundred and forty dollars and fifty cents, leaving  
a balance of seven hundred and fifty nine dollars and fifty cents due the State from  
the said Lowe - Ordered, that the Clerk of the Council request the Attorney General to  
cause suit to be brought against the said Lowe and his securities to recover back the  
said sum of seven hundred and fifty nine dollars and fifty cents, and that the said  
Clerk of the Council furnish the Attorney General with a copy of the Bond given by the  
said Contractor for the due performance of his duties - as also a statement of the sum  
advanced and accounted for.
