Tuesday January 22

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honorable Israel D. Maulsby, Thomas H. Wilkinson and Nicholas Brewer.

Ordered that the Arsenals at Frederick Town deliver to Captain William Heblitzel, or to his order, in good and sufficient condition, seventy five stand of muskets and accoutrements, for the use of the Uniformed Company commanded by him, attached to the 50<sup>th</sup> Regiment in Allegany County - the expense of transportation to be defrayed by the Company.

Dec 12 Council Chamber Annapolis January 22 1822

I have received your letter acknowledging the receipt of mine, enclosing an account against the United States, for five hundred dollars, overpaid by the State for arms in September 1811, and asking to be informed how it happens that the account falls short of the appropriation.

By referring to the cost of the arms, and the amount paid by the State, it now appears that she paid \$118.52 over and above what the merchants Swann and Pickett accounted to - of course the difference in amount was for boxes to put them in. The Secretary of War taking it for granted that all the arms paid for would be issued. I have the honor to be with great
