

Ordered, that the Armourer at Annapolis, deliver to Captain William Wheeler, seventy five stand of uncleaned muskets, with the necessary accoutrements, for the use of the Company commanded by him provided the said Wheeler do first pay the expense of packing up, and delivering the said arms, as also the expense of transportation.

By the Petition of Thomas Post, late Sheriff of Washington County, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears, that John Wolgarmot was fined by the Court of the said County, at November term eighteen hundred and nineteen, in three cases, the sum of dollars in each case, for selling spirituous liquors without license. That Abraham Baker was fined by the said Court, at November term eighteen hundred and twenty, two dollars for an assault and Battery. Thomas Chamey five dollars for an assault and Battery. Greenbury McAltee in two cases, one dollar in each case, for assault and batteries, and that Thomas Chamey was fined at March term eighteen hundred and twenty one, twenty five cents for an assault and battery. The Petitioner states, that the said persons after remaining in Jail a considerable time, were set at liberty, there being no prospect of either of them paying the fines. He prays that the said fines may be remitted, otherwise, he will be compelled to pay the same, in addition to considerable fees and Jail charges already incurred by him. The Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County, remit the said fines of dollars each that were imposed on the said John Wolgarmot, and they do further order and direct that the said Abraham Baker, Thomas Chamey and Greenbury
