or, or to do so, I will send you the papers connected with it by Mr. Hubbard. In the
mean time you could have a conversation with Mr. Love respecting it. Should
he have any further accounts against the State for Rations furnished, which
he has always said he had. they can if regular be still acted on. I think he
presented one to the General Assembly two or three years ago and they refused
to allow it. He told me frequently that he furnished Rations to an amount
far exceeding the sums advanced, but that the vouchers were lost either by him
self or Mr. Meredith, and that the persons who received the supplies for the Troops,
in many instances from the hurry and confusion in which things were
necessarily done, omitted to pass their receipts for the Rations. Indeed I
know that he would have lost \$2057.70 the original vouchers having been
by some means mislaid at Easton. Had I not accidentally filed away a
rough statement made out from them by Mr. Meredith and sent to this Dep-
artment, for the purpose of shewing that the Executive would be justified in
paying \$1800, that had been advanced to Mr. Love by the Branch Bank at
Easton, and which was afterwards papered by this Department to the full
amount \$2057.70, and has since been similarly treated by Mr. Wagner. I have
thought it to be right to say this much to you, and have the honour to be with
